Best Practice No.1

Title of the Practices:

COVID-19 Vaccination Camp for Students in Particular and others in general

Goals:

To assist our students and nearby citizens for getting vaccinated against COVID-19

To avail the COVID-19 vaccine for our students at our campus

To motivate students to attend classroom teaching learning after two doses of COVID-19

vaccination

The Context:

The students have shown fearful behaviour in getting vaccinated due to circulation of so many and so different opinions on social media. We at CDCC, felt that our students should get proper information about vaccination which may result in great relief to them about their physical health.

After spread of awareness about COVID-19 vaccine, the limited stock of vaccines resulted into too much rush at Civil Hospital. The lack of unavailability of vaccines have affected the metal health of students at large. This resulted into delay in starting classroom teaching-learning at college campus.

Practice:

We, the college requested Civil Hospital, Roha through proper authorities for organization of Vaccine Drive at our college campus. We have promised to provide all required volunteer



facilities at out campus. We have invited doctors and their assistants to our campus so that they can realized the importance of our demand. Then, we completed all documentary requirements with the civil hospital.

Evidence of success:

- ✓ COVID-19 Vaccine Drive was conducted at our college campus on 26.10.2021
- ✓ Mrs. Snehal Chandorkar and Mr. Suraj Suralkar from Civil Hopsital, Roha have lead the Vaccination Drive at college campus.
- ✓ 62 students of our college have been vaccinated.
- ✓ After complete vaccination of campus, from 15th Nov., 2021 offline classroom teaching started at our college.

Problems Encountered:

We encountered two biggest problems in implementation of online education.

- 1. Maintaining gap of 90 days between two doses of COVID-19 vaccine.
- Contacting students as most of them are from remote rural areas.
 However, we have solved the second problem through mouth publicity of drive and also by using WhatsApp Groups of each class and local journalists.

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Best Practice No. 2

Title of the Practices:

Collaborative Community based extension activities though National Service Scheme

Goal:

To collaborated with government and non-government organizations for community-oriented extension activities

To share the resources- physical, human and financial through collaborations

To ensure maximum participation of volunteers to widen the scope of activities.

To increase the number of beneficiaries from local community along with our own students.

The Context:

Working on community-based issues solely is a limitation to reach to masses at large. Lack of resources is another problem when we work without collaborations. For overcoming on such hurdles and difficulties and for sharing each other resources for community beneficiaries collaborations are more justifiable than working in isolation.

The Practice:
